## PoP's Stained Glass Window #2:

Dear Church,

Pastor Rosenvinge wrote the following article for PoP's January 2005 Newsletter. It describes the "second" stained glass window on left side as you face the windows. I share again below:

On the plains over Bethlehem the skies blazed with light as the angels welcomed Jesus, the newborn king. At Jesus' presentation in the temple when he was 40 days old, Simeon said that Jesus would be a "light for the Gentiles" (non-Jews). Later, a star led the magi (wise men) to the house where the child was. God's brilliant light appears shining in the darkness to light the way to Him for all people, of every nation and tongue. In ancient times when the glory of God appeared, it was often so bright that people could not approach it. Now God's light and glory would be revealed through the life of this child, Jesus.

"Epiphany" is the name that we give the season after Christmas. It comes from a Greek word and means "to show" or "making the divine visible through some deed or action." Stained glass is designed to be like a display of God's glory. The light comes through the window into the sanctuary illuminating the darkness, but it does not enter in a formless way. The light is given shape and color by the glass to show us some aspect of Christ's divinity. In our sanctuary the second window from the left depicts Jesus saying: "*I AM the Good Shepherd*" (John 10:14).



The "I AM" is a direct reference to Jesus' divinity while the "Good Shepherd" reminds us that Jesus watches over and protects his sheep. He carries a lamb in his arm while below him another lamb looks up at him. This picture reminds us that Jesus is the Good Shepherd of all people. Not only did he come to teach, feed, lead and protect, he also came to give his life as a ransom for us. God continues to show Jesus to the world today.

The church and its people are like stained glass that the light and glory of God can shine through. You're sharing the good news of Jesus, supporting the poor, feeding the hungry, praying for the sick, teaching children and much more are all illustrations of God's love, mercy and glory shining into our world. Each of your deeds done in Christ's name is like a piece of stained glass, His glory shining through!

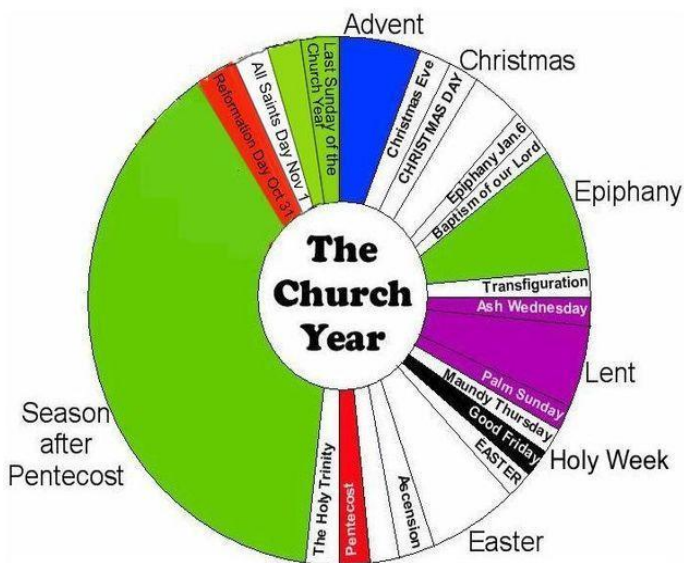
As your elders, we encourage you to be faithful in worship both on Sundays and also as we gather together for the midweek Lenten services on Wednesdays.

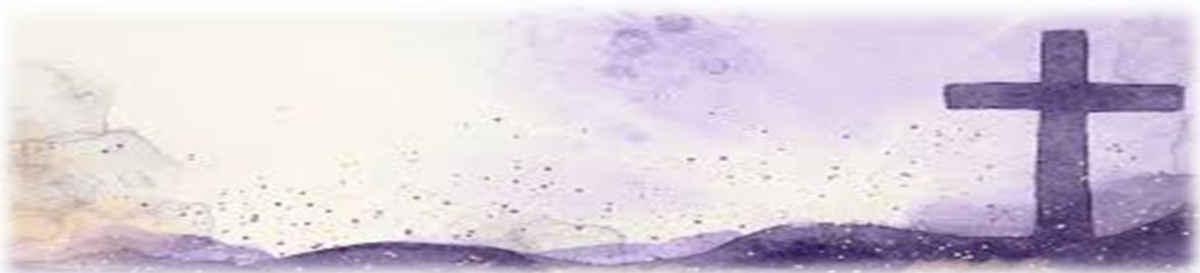
## PoP Preschool News & Events:

### HOLY COMMUNION STATEMENT

In the Sacrament of Holy Communion our Lord Jesus comes to us with **His very body & blood** to eat & to drink **for the forgiveness of sins & to strengthen our union with Him & with one another**. He invites to His table those who trust His words, **repent of all their sin** & forgive & love one another as He forgives & loves us.

Because those who eat & drink our Lord's body & blood unworthily do so to their great harm & because **Holy Communion is a confession of the faith** which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation & the LCMS, & yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to **speak with the Pastor before communing**. *For further study, see Matt. 5:23ff, 10:32ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-29; Acts 2:38, 42; 1 Cor. 10:16, 11:17-34*

Other Christians & children who have not completed instruction may come forward, cross their arms over their chest & receive a blessing. **During distribution, the Individual Cup will be offered first followed by the Common Cup**. For those who prefer it for any reason, the cups in **the center of the tray contain a grape juice option**. Please let the pastor know if you need a **Gluten Free wafer**. Before communing, we ask that first time guests & visitors please speak with the Pastor. their chest & receive a blessing. **During distribution, the Individual Cup will be offered first followed by the Common Cup**. For those who prefer it for any reason, the cups in **the center of the tray contain a grape juice option**. Please let the pastor know if you need a **Gluten Free wafer**.
