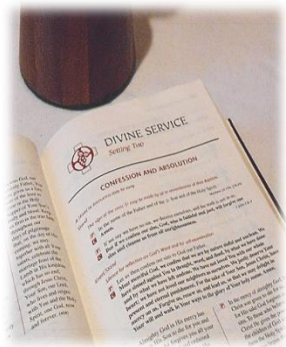

About our Liturgy:



Worship (or what we call the *Divine Service*) is an important and central part of our life as a congregation here at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. I am happy that you are part of the church. This newsletter article is to help you understand why we worship as we do.

If you have never attended a Lutheran Divine Service before, much of what we do may seem strange and unfamiliar to you. That's okay! In the beginning, it was to us too! You see, the Lutheran Divine Service is not easy to learn. That is because it is full of symbolism, our rich heritage, and unique Biblical language.

But don't let the difficulty stop you! Anything worth learning takes time, like learning to play a musical instrument, or learning to drive a car, or practicing a sport – the more you do it, the easier it becomes and the better you understand.

Think of our worship service as a dance — the “Lutheran Two-Step.” While it's not the hokey-pokey or the chicken dance, the

steps involved might make you feel a bit uneasy. However, these steps reflect a rich worship heritage rooted in the teachings of the Bible. We believe these are important steps worth learning. The explanation below will help you understand why we dance the way we do, as we strive to keep Jesus Christ at the center of our lives and worship.

Our Liturgy Unites

People of all ages, ethnic groups, and backgrounds are united in our liturgy. We do not “target” any one group, but strive to unite us all – young and old, rich and poor – in the body of Christ.

The liturgy is not natural to anyone when they first hear it. The church has a language and culture of its own, which we are all drawn into. This gives us a new common identity based not upon human factors, but upon our being children of God.

Our Liturgy is Historic

We're not innovative. Although the liturgy does change and adapt as each generation makes it their own, we do not change and adopt the latest fads and trends. We use the liturgy that has been handed down to us since the time of the Old Testament, uniting us with believers of all times.

All changes to this liturgy come slowly, over time, in a conservative manner, so that these changes belong to the Church, not only to one segment of her.

Many people think that the one hour they spend in church on Sunday morning is to serve God. Not so! We serve God with our whole lives, all 168 hours of the week, as we live the lives He has given us as fathers, mothers, workers, friends, etc! When we gather in church it is the time that *our Savior serves us!* He comes to us with His gifts of Word and Sacrament and feeds us, strengthens our faith, so that we can live as His children in this sinful world.



As the Scriptures tell us, Jesus came “*not to be served, but to serve*” (*Matthew 20:28*). And this He is still doing in the church. Here we come *to receive* from Him!

Our Liturgy Focuses on Christ

In our liturgy, we focus not on ourselves or what pleases us, but on Christ. The liturgy is almost completely quotations from the Scriptures, and those parts that are not are paraphrases from the Scriptures. Here we come into the presence of our Savior to receive His gifts, and our liturgy focuses on that.



The Three Main Parts of our Worship

- 1.) The service begins with **The Preparation**, where we confess our sin to God and receive His forgiveness. Thus, cleansed and forgiven, we are free to come into His presence and receive His gifts. You will notice that it is at this point that the pastor first walks back to the altar, to show this in a visual way.
- 2.) The service continues with **The Liturgy of the Word**. Of primary importance in this part is that we hear the Word of God in the reading of the Scriptures and the proclamation of the Gospel in the sermon. In these you hear not the words and opinions of man, which change and err, but the voice of our Lord, eternal and truthful, speaking to His own.
- 3.) After receiving the gift of God's Word, **The Liturgy of the Sacrament**, or Holy Communion, is celebrated. Here we enter into the most intimate union with our God as we actually eat His body and drink His blood. And with this eating and drinking, God promises us His forgiveness, life, and salvation.

Having received these and the fullness of His gifts, we then joyfully depart back out into the world with His blessing, to share His Word and forgiveness with others.

Although there are many elements to the dance, there are really two key steps. The **first step** is **God graciously coming (↓) to His people through Word and Sacrament** to give us **forgiveness, life, and salvation**. The **second step** is **our response to God's grace (↑) with prayer, praise, our offerings, and thanksgiving**. It is this rhythm—God to us and then us to God—that marks and defines our worship. Most importantly, these steps reflect how God saved us through faith in Christ and how we respond by bearing fruit of faith in good works for the benefit of our neighbors.

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.
Ephesians 2:8-10

Board of Elders (BoE) September 2026:

Shepherd's Staff is the name of the computer software that retains information about our church and its members. Things like baptisms, confirmations, weddings, etc. are recorded in it. Over the past 4-5 years with the changes in Pastors (3), and secretaries (4), some of that information was not entered and some was not entered correctly. In an attempt to get this corrected, the BoE will be contacting all of their families to obtain their information. Pastor Rosenvinge will be training and assisting our secretary to get all this information inputted correctly so that if someone needs it in the future it will be there.

On Saturday August 22 we had a congregational meeting with the Southeastern (SED) District President and our Circuit Visitor. The SED President explained the call process and the various choices we have in choosing our next Pastor.

The meeting was well attended with approximately 70 members attending. The call committee, our retired Pastors and Pastor Prince all agree that we should call an intentional interim Pastor that will serve our congregation for 18-24 months. Many of you were here when we had Pastor Gordon Beck as an intentional interim Pastor before we called Pastor Rosenvinge. This will help us grow as a congregation and help us to make sure we pick the right Pastor for our church. The decision is ultimately up to the voting members of the church and will be decided at our congregational voters meeting on September 20th.

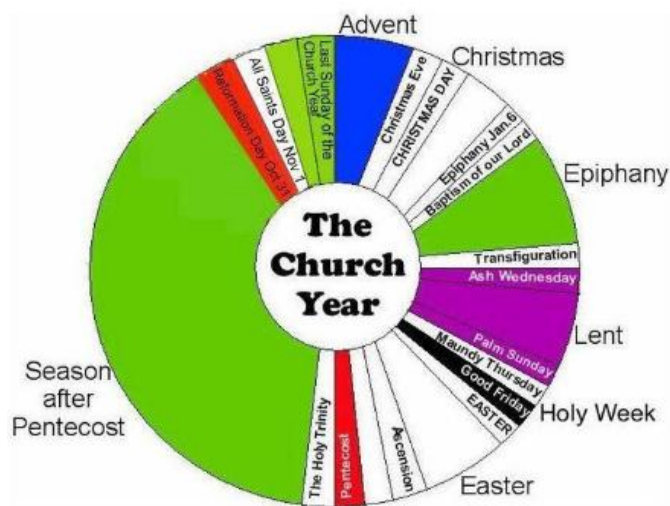
As all of you are hopefully aware, Pastor Prince is being transferred to Okinawa and his last service will be August 30th. After that our congregation will receive Pastoral care from Chaplains Bomberger and Kintz, Pastor Rosenvinge and Pastor Nieting. Pastor Nieting will be the supervising Pastor and will serve as Vacancy Pastor hopefully until we call an intentional interim Pastor. He will be in the office 2 days a week and will be visiting the homebound. As mentioned above, Pastor Rosenvinge will be working on Shepherd's Staff and will be in office some too. Please pray and ask God to give Pastors Nieting and Rosenvinge strength and energy to help us through this vacancy period.

Elder Antar Wilson is working on starting up a shared Youth Program with other local LCMS churches that don't have a program. He talked with the SED President about it and received enthusiastic support. Pray that his efforts will be successful!

At the request of Pastor Nieting, Elder Jarett Macmaster has donated a wagon for food pantry donations. A sign will be made also. Please look for it and place your donations in the wagon.

From Your Call Committee - August 2028:

Thank you, District President Harmon and Circuit Visitor Martin, for being with us last weekend and to all who prepared for, participated in, brought food and prayed for our congregation meeting. We have some "take aways" to consider as we go forward. Most importantly, it is to remember that God graciously gives gifts to His church and that He will provide.



We believe that this is a holy, divine process moved by the Holy Spirit and so we prayerfully seek God's will and guidance.

We heard about four ways to continue the ministry of our congregation:

1. Get temporary fill-in Pastors week by week.
2. Use a vacancy pastor. They provide limited direction and service as a temporary fill-in.
3. Call a full-time pastor.
4. Call an Intentional Interim pastor. This is a special kind of pastor trained to lead congregations in a vacancy and to prepare for their next phase of ministry and call of a permanent pastor. An intentional interim pastor is limited to less than two years of serving full time in a congregation.

Your Call Committee will meet in September to continue their work. Please pray for them, for the pastor whom God will send, and that we are open to God's will and leading. Your thoughts and prayers are vital to the life of the church. You may share them with the call committee members.

HOLY COMMUNION STATEMENT

In the Sacrament of Holy Communion our Lord Jesus comes to us with **His very body & blood** to eat & to drink **for the forgiveness of sins & to strengthen our union with Him & with one another**. He invites to His table those who trust His words, **repent of all their sin** & forgive & love one another as He forgives & loves us.

Because those who eat & drink our Lord's body & blood unworthily do so to their great harm & because **Holy Communion is a confession of the faith** which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation & the LCMS, & yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to **speak with the Pastor before communing**. *For further study, see Matt. 5:23ff, 10:32ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-29; Acts 2:38, 42; 1 Cor. 10:16, 11:17-34.*

Other Christians & children who have not completed instruction may come forward, cross their arms over their chest & receive a blessing. **During distribution, the Individual Cup will be offered first followed by the Common Cup**. For those who prefer it for any reason, the cups in **the center of the tray contain a grape juice option**. Please let the pastor know if you need a **Gluten Free wafer**. Before communing, we ask that first time guests & visitors please speak with the Pastor.
